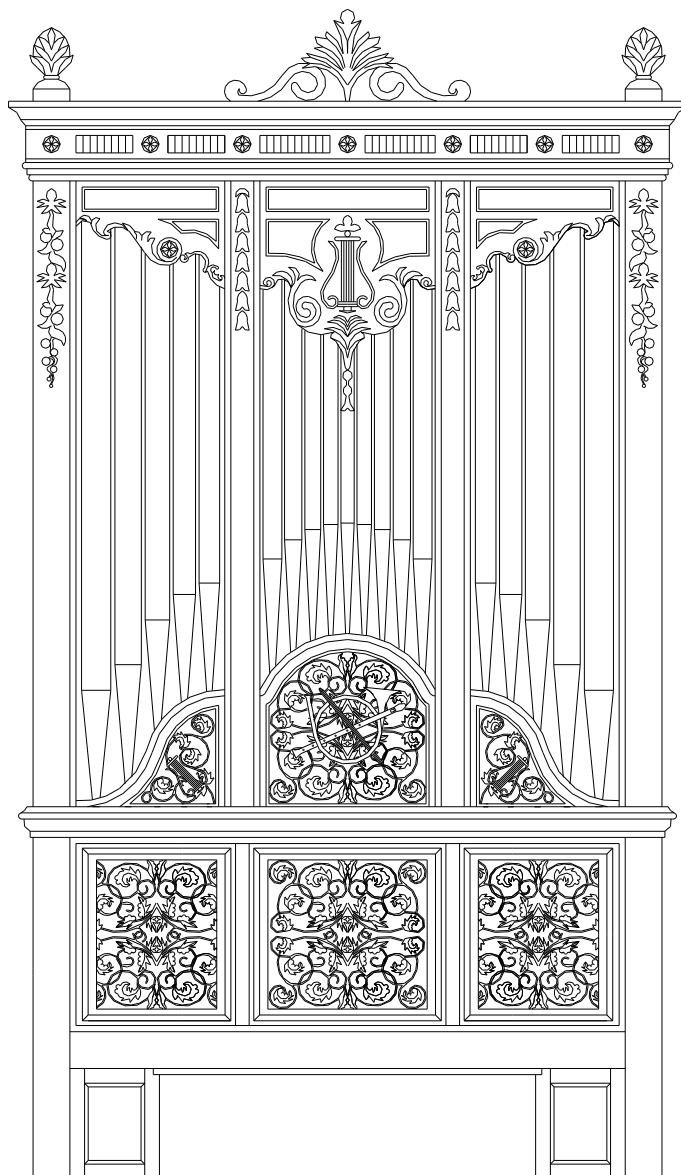

The organ stands at the head of the south gallery of this Georgian church; the console is detached, with tracker key actions and electric drawstop actions. The front pipes are of tin.

The original casework, made earlier this century, has been redesigned and re-made. It is modelled on an eighteenth-century Snetzler design at Sculthorpe, Norfolk. The pipe shades have been altered and the curved pipe-blocks are new; the decorated panels were carved by Derek Riley.

The manual compass is 58 notes; the pedal 30 notes

The electric blower supplies the wind through double-rise reservoirs
