

# ST MARY'S CHURCH, BOURNE STREET LONDON SW1



The organ was built in 1913 by Lewis & Co, who retained some pipework from the Walker organ of 1875. In 1928 the organ was rebuilt in its present form by Henry Willis & Sons; a small chancel section was prepared for but never installed. Some further work was carried out by N P Mander in 1984; this included provision of the enclosed Pedal stops.

In 2006 the organ was restored and a Trumpet was added to the Great organ.

The organ stands in the west gallery of the church; the case, by Gambier Parry, dates from the early twentieth century.
