The organ was built by Harrison \& Harrison in 1937, with four manuals and 84 speaking stops, and was used for the first time at the Coronation of King George VI. Some pipework from the previous fivemanual Hill organ was revoiced and incorporated in the new scheme.

The two organ cases, designed in the late nineteenth century by J.L. Pearson, were reinstated and coloured in 1959 under the direction of Stephen Dykes Bower. The north case contains the Choir Organ and Pedal Open Diapason; the south case contains the Great Organ and the other screen Pedal stops. The Swell and Solo Organs are in the south triforium; the console is placed centrally on the east side of the screen.
In 1982 and 1987 the organ was restored and enlarged. Additions included the unenclosed Choir Organ, and the console was rebuilt with a fifth manual for the Bombarde Organ. The primary purpose of this department is to give the organ an extra dimension for great occasions, especially when there is a large congregation in the nave. The Bombarde flue chorus is placed in the north triforium immediately above the organ case; the three reeds, which are celebratory trumpets on ten-inch wind pressure, are placed one bay further west.
